We can tailor solutions to meet the needs of individuals, keeping them safe in their own home, within shared living and when they are out in the community. For those moving into more independent settings solutions can be supplied that initially monitor people intensively (with their permission) and then step down to only manage the ongoing risks as people settle into their new homes.

Enabling Good Lives Vision: Disabled children and adults and their families will have greater choice and control over their supports and lives and make more use of natural and universally available supports. In Christchurch the EGL approach is open to ORS* funded high school students. Young people and their families work alongside an Enabling Good Lives Connector / Kaitūhono to dream big, make a plan for the future and connect with their local community. The young person and whānau also have access to an EGL personal budget which combines all of the disability support funding into one resource which can be used flexibly to achieve their goals and live their good life.

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Choices NZ

Choices NZ works with people with disabilities and health needs to achieve employment and thrive on the job. We partner with local businesses to make this happen. We can provide employment-related case management, including any required and agreed coaching assistance, while working with you to identify open and inclusive employment opportunities.

Adult Conductive Education Trust (ACET) assists tāngata whaikaha, disabled people with cerebral palsy and other neurological conditions to maintain routine life skills and help them reach their maximum potential. To achieve this, we provide weekly holistic/physical sessions facilitated by a Conductor (specialist trained in Conductive Education) and a Speech and Language Therapist in both a group and on an individual basis. We also offer weekly group music and movement sessions lead by a registered Music Therapist. The holistic therapy and practices of our programmes use the principles of conductive education and are based on the concept of "Every day people in every day places doing every day things".

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Halberg Foundation

Disability Sport Charity who aims to enhance the lives of physically disabled young people by enabling them to participate in sport, recreation and play.



Te Whatu Ora Waitaha Project SEARCH

Project SEARCH is an employer led one-year internship programme for students with learning disabilities (ORS funded) in their final year of school. It is targeted to students whose goal is paid employment. The learning takes place within the Canterbury District Health Board, where total immersion in the workplace facilitates the teaching and learning process as well as the acquisition of employability and marketable work skills. Interns participate in three unpaid internships to explore a variety of career paths.

Interns work with a team that includes their family, their Project SEARCH tutor, skills trainer, job developer and other partners to create an employment goal and support the student during this important transition from school to work. Located in Anakiwa in the Marlborough Sounds, we help you reach your full potential through challenge in the outdoors. - Can assist with enquiries re accessing medical assistance and options for children & adults with potential ADHD, autism & other disabilities.
- Assists with collating Pre medical diagnostic assessment forms .
- Provides ongoing post diagnostic information, education and support.
- · After hour access support is available.
- There is a fee. Depending on what is advised and family /adult patient personal choice, there will be costs associated with a private paediatric assessment for children, or a medical consultative assessment for teenagers and adults.
